About Book 1 - Jayben and the Golden Torch

Can one boy with no memories save the world?

In the Earth world, a boy dreams of faraway lands to escape life with his horrible aunt. In the Elf world, he wakes up with a mysterious golden torch but without any clue who he is ... except for the compass he pulls from his pocket, engraved with one name: JAYBEN.

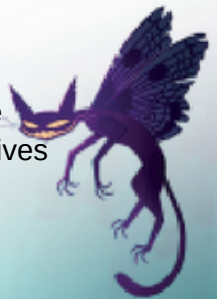
Jayben discovers that many moons ago, a giant put a dark spell on the golden torch, and the elves forgot everything that had come before. Now they hang precious memories in jars on trees, just to try to remember. But a new darkness grows among them...

An evil villain called Null is burning down the forests, hellbent on finding the torch and becoming the most powerful being ever to live. If Jayben can find his own magic and ignite the torch with its fierce violet flame, his power will be unstoppable...

About the Author

At 19 years old Thomas Leeds was hit by a London black cab. Whilst he was lucky to survive, his childhood memories did not. Unable to remember the places he loved as a child or to recognise faces, including those of his family, Thomas set about building a new life. Without knowing where his beginning was, he began adjusting to a future that included navigating the severe epilepsy that resulted from his brain injury. 11 years later, creating an 80s playlist for his upcoming 30th birthday, Thomas heard the first line of the Waterboys' The Whole of the Moon and his childhood memories began to emerge.

Thomas held on to those memories and with them came the seed of his debut middle-grade novel, exploring and championing the power of memory and epilepsy. Nowadays, Thomas lives in Essex with his wife (the only face he can remember) and his two daughters.

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Theme 1 - The Book of Dreamers

In this extract from Book 1, Larnie is reading aloud from The Book of Dreamers to Jayben, Tedrick and Phee...

*The Earth and the Elf World have a relationship that reaches far back in history. In the **Magic Ages**, the Energy flowed through the Golden Torch in both directions, allowing everyone in the Elf World and Earth World alike to remember, think and dream. Here, the Torch blazed day and night, with its dazzling violet flame.*

But one dark day an angry giant took control of the Torch. He used a magic spell to put out the violet flame, only an invisible charge remained through the torch. And when the Torch is not lit with a fierce violet light, the Energy stream will only flow one way – to Earth.

The giant then hid the Torch away.

*With the Torch now extinguished, Energy in the Elf World began to run out. The elves became forgetful. This worried their leaders. They began to use the trees to preserve jars of their memories and their history. And so the five forests of the Elf World became the five **Memory Woods**.*

Gradually, over time, the memories stored in the woods became less and less.

Elves forgot how to dream and so lost their old magic.

*It was the end of the **Magic Ages**.*

But there is hope. There is always hope. For a prophecy has been foretold. A prophecy of the Dreamers.

- Summarise everything you have learnt from this extract in as few words as possible.



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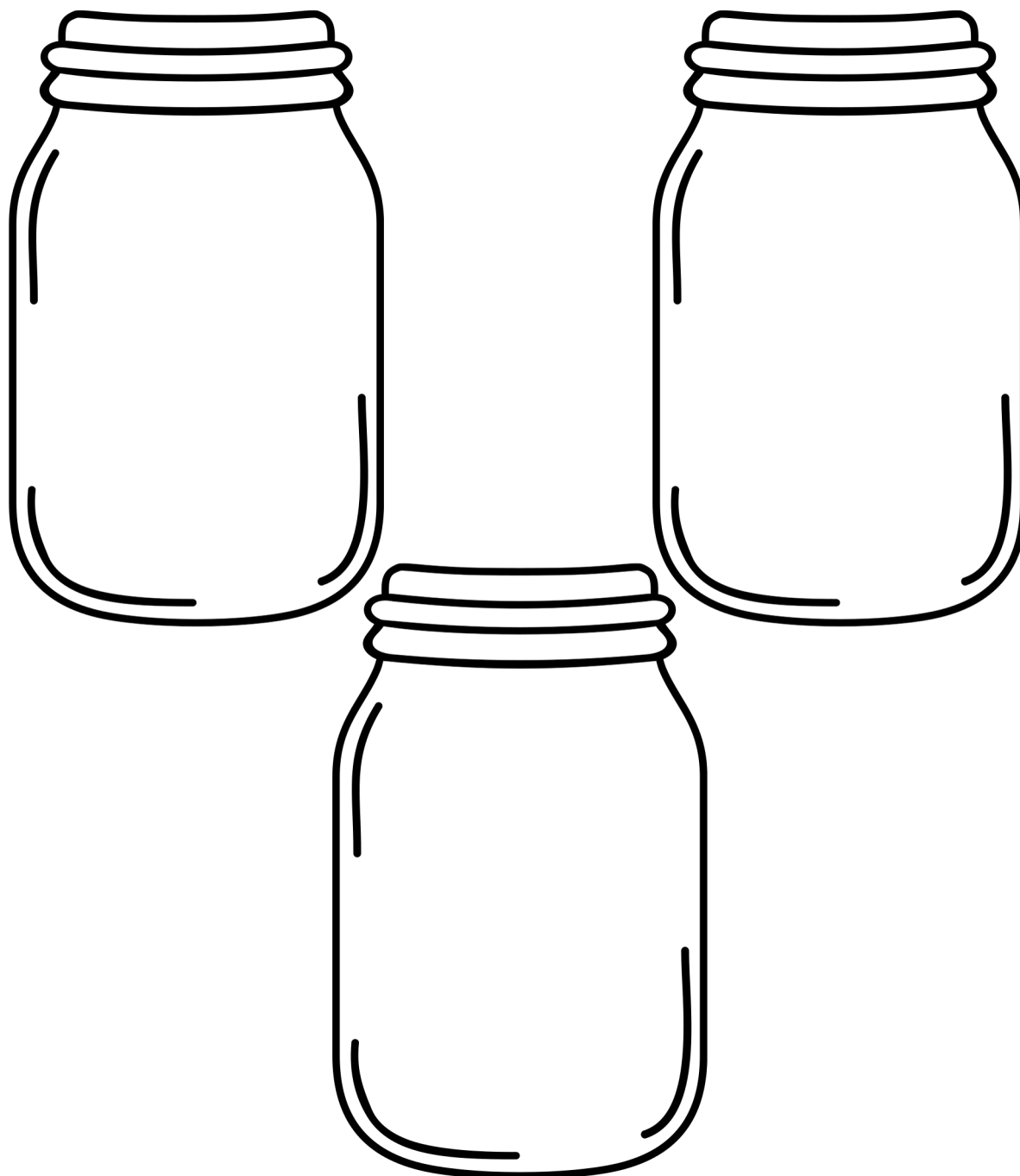
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Theme 1 - The Book of Dreamers

- Jayben experiences absence seizures. Absence seizures are a type of epileptic seizure. Read the information below to learn more about epilepsy and absence seizures. If you have any further questions about epilepsy, you could ask a school nurse or first aider to help you find out more.

Epilepsy is a common condition that affects the brain and causes frequent seizures.

Seizures are bursts of electrical activity in the brain that temporarily affect how it works. They can cause a wide range of symptoms. Seizures can affect people in different ways, depending on which part of the brain is involved.

An absence seizure is one type of seizure. When somebody has an absence seizure, they lose awareness of their surroundings for a short time. Absence seizures usually only last up to 15 seconds and they can happen several times a day. When a person has had an absence seizure, they won't remember what has happened.

Raynor looked baffled. 'Impossible,' she said. 'You don't control your power. Your memory hasn't returned, has it?'

'No. But I did light it,' insisted Jayben. 'It's how I saved Last Rock. And I lit it before then, too.'

'No Dreamer has ever lit the Torch without finding their chord and, with it, their memory.'

'Well, they had help from the Book,' Jayben said, annoyed to have it pointed out yet again. 'They had maps, instructions, a prophecy. I only have a missing page. It's been hard, but I needed to light it – and I did.'

'That's . . . that's extraordinary!'

'Yeah,' said Phee. 'I know it sucks that you don't remember, Ben, and the Book isn't much help. But in a weird way, maybe that missing page sets you free a bit? It can't define you. You get to write it.'

- If you could ask Thomas Leeds three questions, what would you ask him?



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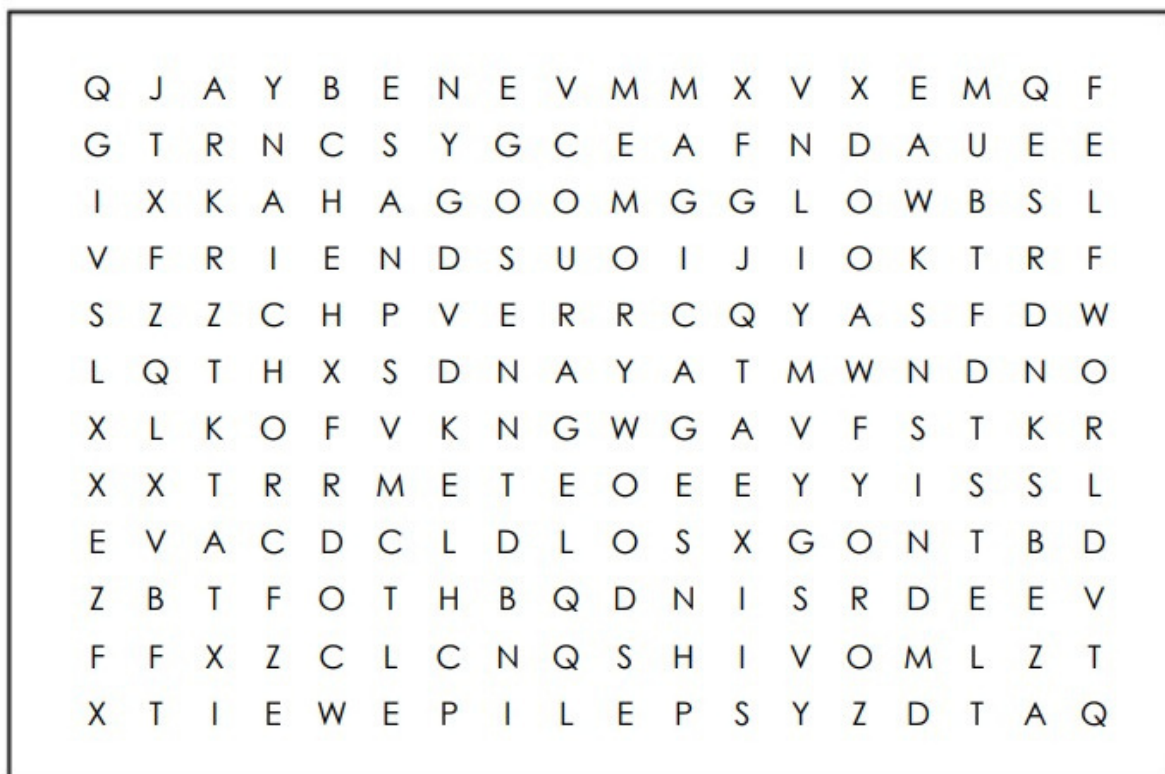
